### Jamestown Jammers Luncheon With Former Pittsburgh Pirate Kent Tekulve



Former Pirates pitcher, World Series Champion and All-Star, Kent Tekulve will be the guest speaker for a luncheon hosted by the Jamestown Jammers at the Conewango Club in Warren, PA on Monday April 7th. The event is sponsored by Northwest Savings Bank and less than 100 tickets of the original 200 still remain available.

Tickets for the event are \$15 and must be purchased in advance by calling the Jammers front office at [\(716\)-664-0915](tel:716-664-0915). A traditional buffet lunch featuring chicken, pasta and additional sides will be served to all attendees. Doors will open at 11:30am, and the luncheon is scheduled to run from noon until 1pm. Tekulve will be available for an autograph signing after the speaking portion of the event is completed.

The Jammers staff is excited to share the experiences of a respected Pirate Alumni. "The opportunity to bring the celebrated Tekulve to our fan base in Chautauqua County and Warren, PA was a possibility we could not pass up. I anticipate this event will be sold out, so I urge you to get your tickets as soon as possible," said Jammers General Manager Matthew Drayer.

Tekulve is currently a Pirates analyst for Root Sports Pittsburgh. Tekulve signed as a free agent with Pittsburgh in 1969 and made his major league debut for the Pirates in 1974. He spent 11 years with the Pirates and went on to play for both the Philadelphia Phillies, and Cincinnati Reds before retiring in 1989. Tekulve played a crucial role in helping the Pirates win the 1979 World Series by saving 3 games including the decisive seventh game. He was an All-Star in 1980. Tekulve was known for his unique submarine delivery. He pitched in 1,050 games and had a career record of 94-90. He had 184 saves and a career ERA of 2.85. Tekulve also led the major leagues in appearances on four different occasions (1978, 1979, 1982, 1987).

The Jamestown Jammers are the Class A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. They are owned and operated by a local Buffalo company, Rich Products Corporation, which also owns the AA Northwest Arkansas Naturals and AAA Buffalo Bisons.

# **Chautauqua Sports Hall of Fame Induction Process FAQ's**

## **1. Who can be inducted into the CSHOF?**

For induction into the Chautauqua Sports Hall of Fame, a nominee must have been born in, lived in, or achieved in Chautauqua County a name in the world of sports.

Our inductees are from Brocton to Busti, from Clymer to Conewango, from Fredonia to Frewsburg, from Panana to Pine Valley, from Silver Creek to Sherman and from all points in between.

The nominee must meet at least one of the following criteria:

Is or was an outstanding athlete in high school, college, amateur or professional sports.

Is or was a coach, manager, official or administrator who has made a significant contribution to sports.

Is an individual who is performing or has performed distinguished service in fostering, developing or effectively helping a sport to prosper.



## **2. How many inductees are in the Hall of Fame and what sports are represented?**

There are currently 153 inductees in the CSHOF from a wide diversity of sports including: auto racing, baseball, basketball, bowling, boxing, canoeing, football, golf, hockey, horseshoes, ice skating, motorcycle racing, pool, rowing, roller skating, shooting, sled dog racing, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball, weightlifting and wrestling.

## **3. Who can make a nomination?**

The CSHOF only receives nominations from the public. A nomination form is available from secretary Russ Ecklund at 716-484-7684 or downloadable at

#### **4. What else needs to be submitted with the nomination form?**

It is necessary that all supporting documentation be submitted with the nomination form. The CSHOF does not do any research of its own. We totally rely on the nominator to provide all pertinent information. In addition to a biography of the candidate, copies of scrapbooks, yearbooks, newspaper clippings, magazine articles and photographs are extremely valuable in presenting the qualifications of the nominee.

#### **5. Who decides which nominees are inducted?**

The process begins in September of each year when a pre-selection committee, comprised of fifteen CSHOF directors, carefully reviews the files of all nominees of record. The pre-selection committee then submits a slate of up to 25 possible candidates to the selection committee.

In October, the selection committee, comprised of fifteen different CSHOF directors, narrows the list of the possible nominees to a final list of candidates, generally four to eight, which it forwards to the full board of directors.

Finally in November, the entire 30-member board of directors reviews the recommendations of the selection committee and makes the ultimate decision as to who will be inducted.

The announcement of honorees is made annually on December 1.

#### **6. Is it necessary to re-nominate someone each year?**

No, once a candidate is nominated, the file remains active indefinitely. It is reviewed annually. Additional information to enhance a file, plus letters of recommendation and support, are encouraged and always welcome.
